


Hears and says the initial sound in words


Listens to and joins in with stories and poems, when reading one-to-one and in small groups Attempts to write their own name, or other names and words, using combinations of lines, circles and curves, or letter-type shapes





Continues to explore colour and how colours can be changed Develops an understanding of using lines to enclose a space, and begins to use drawing to represent actions and objects based on imagination, observation and experience Uses various construction materials, e.g. joining pieces, stacking vertically and horizontally, balancing, making enclosures and creating spaces Uses tools for a purpose Uses available resources to create props or creates imaginary ones to support play













Talking about different feelings.
Enjoys playing alone, alongside and with others, inviting others to play and attempting to join others' play.
Seeks out companionship with adults and other children, sharing experiences and play ideas Is more able to recognise the impact of their choices and behaviours/actions on others and knows that some actions and words can hurt others' feelings
Has a clear idea about what they want to do in their play and how they want to go about it



Listens to familiar stories with increasing attention and recall Shows understanding of prepositions such as under, on top, behind by carrying out an action or selecting correct picture

Can retell a simple past event in correct order


Beginning to use a range of tenses Introduces a storyline or narrative into their play





Physical Development

Manipulates a range of tools and equipment in one hand, tools include paintbrushes, scissors, hairbrushes, toothbrush, scarves or ribbons Dresses with help, e.g. puts arms into openfronted coat or shirt when held up, pulls up own trousers, and pulls up zipper once it is fastened at the bottom
