Out unit concluded with a

visit to Carlton Marshes for a Discovering Darwin day to consolidate and extend their understanding.



The children have really enjoyed their Woodland Art sessions over the last few weeks. The focus has been on collage and landscape art. They have explored the work of Andy Goldsworthy and created their own land art silhouettes. Also, they have developed their weaving skills and have used natural resources to create some effective weaving patterns.



This week, the children have visited Carlton Marshes to discover more about evolution and inheritance to further their Science knowledge and understanding. They had a range of different challenges to solve, working in groups around the marsh. They were all extremely well-behaved and demonstrated being Active Citizens.
