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<u>Virtual Water Aid</u>

In January, we welcomed Deirdre from Water Aid to raise our awareness of places in the world that do not have access to clean running water like we do. We learnt about the work that Water Aid does in facilitating these places to access clean water, decent toilets and good hygiene. We learnt about rainwater harvesting, pumping from wells and tippy taps.

Grace the Piano Lady Virtual Visit (EYFS)

EYFS had a virtual visit from Grace the Piano Lady! Grace taught us how to read musical notes and we made our own rhythms up for animals using wooden sticks, spoons and clapping. All the children and adults had a wonderful time.

Norwich City Assembly

Jake and Billy from the Norwich City Community Sports Foundation led virtual assembly sessions for us. They focussed on the importance of positive relationships in our lives and ways to resolve conflict.

Fisheries Assembly

Linford, a fisheries scientist, from CEFAS visited us online for a virtual 'What's on the Beach?' assembly. He shared an interesting and informative presentation about many of the creatures we might find on our beaches and left us with an exciting scavenger hunt to complete.

Becoming a Paramedic Assembly

Rhianna, a paramedic from The East of England Ambulance Services, virtually visited our school and talked to us about her career as a paramedic. She explained some of the challenges of being a paramedic but mostly described her love of the job and why she finds it so rewarding. Rhianna talked about the subjects she needed to do well in at school and how she then trained further at University to become qualified. The children were really inspired by her visit and asked lots of questions about the life of a paramedic.

Across the school, our children took part in a number of activities. Activities included designing and creating an emotion t-shirt for 'inside out' day, making gratitude boxes, thinking about what makes us special and making 'special hands' filled with people that are significant in our lives.
