

In our Science learning, the pupils became forensic scientists. They found out what a forensic scientist does and why their job is so important. As part of their learning, they dusted for fingerprints, explored the prints and discovered the subtle differences between each set of prints.

As designers, the children investigated a range of fairground rides, observed how they moved and identified the rotating parts. Next, they sketched a plan for their own fairground ride and created it using K'NEX. Once the structure was built, they included an electrical circuit with a motor to make the ride move. Finally, they evaluated their own and others' designs.



Roman Dance Workshop



We had a brilliant workshop with Lorraine from Multicultural Dance based on the Romans, as part of our History unit. The pupils embraced the session and developed their own ancient Roman dances based on an image from



Pompeii. They all performed their dances at the end and Lorraine was really impressed with their interpretations and collaboration.
